**Stay water safe with the summer coming.** We want you to enjoy your summer and stay safe in and around the water. Tombstoning is a dangerous craze which involves jumping off high levels into the sea. If you know someone who might be involved in tombstoning please discourage them from taking part. It's important that peer pressure doesn't affect their judgment or influence them to join in this hazardous activity, which can result in serious injury. Why is it dangerous?

1: Nobody is completely sure what is beneath the water and how shallow it could be.  
2: Submerged objects like rocks. They may not be visible and can cause serious injury if people jump onto them.  
3: The shock of cold water may make it difficult to swim. 4: Other children may copy others' actions  
5: Strong currents can rapidly sweep people away from the shore  
Community wardens are working closely with the Police to help prevent injury through tombstoning. If you are concerned call the Police on 101 (or 999 in an emergency) or contact community wardens on 08000 853840.

**Portsmouth is a city of dog lovers** Portsmouth is a city of dog lovers and the vast majority are responsible and clean up after their dogs mess. But we still need your help to make our city even cleaner. If you witness someone failing to pick up after their dog or if you want to report instances of dog mess you can call 0800 085 38 40, you can also report it via our website which is <https://www.portsmouth.gov.uk/ext/the-council/report-it.aspx>. The more evidence we have the more likely we can sort out the problem. If possible, please provide information on: times when the offence(s) took place • description of the dog • description of the owner • address they are seen entering or leaving • vehicle registration.

**A CRUEL rogue trader** who charmed a pensioner into paying more than £140,000 from her life savings for 'worthless' maintenance work has been jailed. Michael McCann, 25, first befriended his victim, a Southsea woman in her 70s, before tricking her into handing over £20,000 in cash and signing away £123,000 in cheques over several months. Heartless McCann used 'blackmail' to stop her going to the authorities – but a PCSO concerned about the work alerted Portsmouth City Council's trading standards team. Now he has been condemned as 'especially cruel' after he was jailed for 32 months at Portsmouth Crown Court for making thousands from bogus work.
